Laura's Fundraising Marathon

Laura raised over \$7,100 in pledges for her marathon run to help GRNE. We're overwhelmed by people's generosity, and Laura's perseverance and caring as she went on this venture to help Greyhounds in need. Here's a letter from her:

As I reflect back on Monday, April 18th, 2016, the day of the Boston Marathon, I have such happy and fun memories of the day. In the moments of April 18th, 2016, specifically between the time of 11:15am until 3:36pm, I remember thinking, this is f*ing hell and I'll never do this AGAIN. I even told my friend Missy who soldiered 23 miles of the race with me and my husband Steve (immediately following the race before a shower and food) that I will never again do this.

My 10th marathon, it was supposed to be easy and I was supposed to run a decent time based on my training in the January-March months. Toeing the line with other charity runners, Missy and I weaved our way in and out of some of the slower to start runners. We had a good pace and felt pretty good. Fast forward to mile 12 just by Wellesley, and I wanted to give up. I was too hot, too weak (thanks to some sort of bug picked up in Costa Rica) and just felt horrible. How could I run more than another half of what I had just done plus the Newton Hills and the downhill misery and flats of Cleveland Circle and beyond?

Missy told me that it would get easier. And then I thought of all of you. Every single one of you who had donated to my fundraiser for GRNE. Together, we raised \$7100. Could I report back that I couldn't finish the race because it wasn't my best day? No! And I honestly thought of the dogs who I was fundraising for. Some of these dogs had sat in cages at the tracks for months after their careers were over just waiting to be transported for the real lives to start. The word resilience came to mind. I had to be resilient. This was actually not about me. I had chosen to run for something greater than just my personal, selfish goal



of completing a fast marathon. So I spent the next 14.2 miles dumping water over my head, scanning the crowds on the hills for freeze pops, and yelling at Missy to run up the hills. We had a miserable ball together.

I wanted to thank everyone for their support for my marathon fundraiser. To have 82 individual donations blew my mind. First of all, I didn't know I had 82 people who liked me enough to actually donate. Second, it means a lot that you all donated to help the greyhounds. These pups are amazing animals and seriously deserve every second chance they are given through the adoption program. They don't choose to race and while some have great careers and are treated well, there are others who probably went through hell before they reach GRNE and other greyhound shelters. GRNE is benefiting tremendously from all of your donations and are over the top grateful for the support they've received from you. Third, thanks for supporting me. Through donations, through support, through kind words and encouragement. Thanks to Steve for having to listen to me complain (even more) from January-April.

In conclusion to this unnecessary long email, thank you so much for all of your support for GRNE. It really means the world to me.
